 - to what extent could the information needs be met through existing information systems and sources?

Key terms

Safeguard Information System: As part of the Warsaw Framework on REDD+, developing countries are required to develop "a system for providing information on how the safeguards ... are being <u>addressed</u> and <u>respected</u> throughout the implementation of [REDD+] activities."¹ This system is generally referred to as the **Safeguard Information System or 'SIS'**. However, the UNFCCC does not provide any guidance as to what type information is expected to be provided to demonstrate how safeguards are being 'addressed' and 'respected' throughout the implementation of their REDD+ activities.²

Potential Functions of the SIS:

- Compilation and aggregation of information: Since much of the information used in the SIS is likely to be drawn from information that is 'collected' by multiple relevant systems and sources, the SIS would potentially need to compile and aggregate all this information.
- Analysis of aggregated information: through this function, the SIS will analyse
 the aggregated information and offer an assessment as to how the country
 specific safeguards are being 'addressed and respected'.
- Dissemination of information: through this function, the SIS will provide and disseminate the information through appropriate means (e.g. online platform, reports and/or periodic summaries on a regular and proactive basis).

Institutional arrangements of the SIS: who (for example, government institutions and / or specific institutional arrangements between governmental and non-governmental actors) will be involved in the operation of the SIS, and in particular in performing the different functions of the SIS.

SIS Reporting needs: during the process of designing the SIS, a useful step has been to try to define the <u>types of information</u> that could be provided to demonstrate how each of the Cancun safeguards has been addressed and respected throughout the design and implementation of the REDD+ Strategy in the country (that is, the REDD+ Strategy Options and its associated Policies and Measures-PaMs- if they have been defined). This process is often referred to as 'defining the info/reporting needs of the SIS'. This type of information can be qualitative (e.g. narrative description) and/or quantitative in nature (e.g. figures).

The reporting needs can be separated into two main categories:

- Reporting needs to demonstrate how the Cancun safeguards are being Addressed:
 means information describing the [existing or new] governance arrangements
 [e.g.PLRs, institutions, information systems] in place to ensure that the REDD+
 Strategy in the country (that is, the REDD+ Strategy Options and its associated Policies
 and Measures-PaMs- if they have been defined) implemented in accordance with the
 Cancun safeguards.
- Reporting needs to demonstrate how the Cancun safeguards are being Respected:
 means information describing how consistency with the safeguards has been achieved
 during the implementation of the REDD+ Strategy in the country (that is, the REDD+
 Strategy Options and its associated Policies and Measures-PaMs- if they have been
 defined). This information will therefore refer to the outcomes of safeguard measures
 in place.
